
IGCA Reflection

To start off, the first step was collecting the water bottles from our own school mates. As shown below each class from year 9 to year 12 have these boxes in their class cupboard.



Actually the collection of water bottles was a different project organized by my following batch mates: Mohamed Ahmed Almeel, Mohamed A.Nabi, Mahmood Ahmed, Mahmood Abdulaziz and Mahdi Saeed. They did an experiment that shows the amount of water being wasted.



At first the water bottles were collected from each class, then they were taken to the laboratory to measure the amount of water that's left out using measuring cylinder.

The data of their experiment for November is shown below:

WEEK 1	221	10,310
WEEK 2	180	5,500
WEEK 3	218	7,500

After measuring and emptying the bottles, they were kept inside carboard boxes. Refer to the image presented below:
